Quality Improvement Co-ordinator for Southland NGO sector – Deirdre Kokich.

- In role since August
- To work with 30+ NGO providers who have contracts with SDHB.
- History of a passion for quality services: what happens when services do not match delivery to quality systems.
- Important that services get feedback from those who use the service as to the way the service is working. Family / Whanau opinions important also. Also clinical and stakeholder input.
- Quality Cultures within organisations and growing this: are services in line with contracts; are we doing it as well as we can; are we getting feedback; are there quality systems in place.
- Notices providers have good quality systems but sometimes require some short cuts e.g. good templates.
- Are we doing things right?
- Are the right things in place?
- Quality is reasonable amount of work: needs to be resourced e.g. Dierdre's role. Continuous cycle.
- Job to help services set up systems.
- Different ways to have quality checks.

Questions and Answers

Mirror Day Programme – Deb Fraser and Blondie Lewis

- Operating for 5 years.
- Contract for 10 Southland youth a year.
- DVD shown on programme.
- 37 young people from Southland over 5 years.

- Programme embeds Kaupapa Maori; where loosely based on therapeutic community model.
- Harm reduction model; boundary focused. Tension between behaviour management and therapeutic alliance.
- Teacher on staff: approached Ministry of Education re formal contract for teacher 0.5 FTE.
- 3 people on staff.
- Projects are focused around Waitati environment: bush, kayaking, gardening.
- Individualised programmes as well as programme structure.
- Camps occur quarterly. Hui at the end of the year.
- Whanau – engage whanau as possible.
- Stable staffing past 3 years, workforce development, training provided.

Questions and Answers

- Referrals from Southland – 100% better since ADC doing assessments.
- Working with whanau; how to engage whanau from Southland.
- Programme duration – varies.

- NKMP established Oct 2001.
- Kaupapa – everything is connected.
- 62% of clients across all services are Maori.
- Range of services described.
- AOD Service opening day described.
- Team members / data management. Interhealth management system.
- Rangatahi AOD recruiting to position. Wish to offer a rangatahi programme described.
- Adult Provision – 1 – 1 counselling and group therapy.
- Group work based around Te Whare Tapa Wha.
- 36 clients active. Consumer group going.
